2006 Season Overview




The UFRA Fire Crew is a partnership between the State of Utah's Forestry, Fire and State Lands and UFRA. The crew is made up of students from UFRA, managed by the State of Utah's Forestry, Fire and State Lands. This season our crew responded to 24 fires, completed 3 full tours and more than doubled the overtime of any past UFRA crew. We fought fire in Idaho, Utah and Wyoming. Crew orientation began May 3, the crew went available May 15 and ended September 20.

This fire season was extremely busy in Utah and the Western States. We started and ended our season on fires in Utah. Normally the UFRA crew would have ended in mid August. This year however there was enough interest from crewmembers to keep the crew running into September. Once the crew ended in September the remaining crewmembers were assigned to fill in on the Lone Peak Hotshots, Lone Peak Engines and Twin Peaks I.A. crew. This provided valuable learning experiences on other crews for those individuals that stayed on.

Fire Assignment Summary



Our first fire dispatch this year was May 19th to Southern Utah. Fire fuel types ranged from the desert to the big timber of Idaho. Fire assignments ranged from digging hand line, burnout operations, mop-up, to structure protection. The UFRA crew tripled their average amount of fires this year. The crew also made its first trip to Wyoming to fight a wildland fire.

Project Assignment Summary



At the beginning of the season we were able to do project work at the Manorlands of northeastern Utah for the State of Utah. This project consisted of cutting, chipping, or piling of dead and down beetle killed trees. This allowed the crew to get familiar and learn more about using and working chainsaws. Our next couple of projects were under the Good Neighbor Authority with the U.S. Forest Service. projects were in southern Utah putting in new tread for trails that had grown over. This project was helpful in getting the crew ready for cutting hand line on fires on later in the season.

Due to the extreme fire season UFRA did less project work than in years past. In 2005 the crew did a total of 29 days of project work, this year (2006) the crew did a total of 14 days on project. The projects we were on were helpful in preparing and conditioning the crew to fight fire.
