Lone Peak Engines 2024 Crewmember Outreach



The Lone Peak Engines are a State of Utah DNR wildland fire resource based at the Lone Peak Conservation Center in Draper, UT. They consist of two Type 4 wildland fire engines and are staffed with 6 personnel each. The engines are available for fire assignments from May through October and respond to fires across the nation.

The Lone Peak Engines maintain availability for fire assignments 24 hours a day for 7 days a week. In order to facilitate this, crew members are expected to be on-call when not on duty and should be able to respond to the duty station within 90 minutes of being notified of a dispatch for a fire assignment.

When not on a wildland fire assignment, crew members complete fuels reduction projects in communities throughout the state. Project work typically includes brush and tree removal, hazard tree felling or slash pile burning. The projects can be located anywhere in the state and it is often required to camp at the project location due to the length of travel times. Camping gear and food is provided during these situations.

The Lone Peak Conservation Center also hosts two type 2 IA hand crews and two Hotshot crews. This provides additional opportunities for training and advancement.
