Twin Peaks is nationally available Type 2 Initial Attack Hand Crew and is part of Utah's Division of Forestry, Fire & State Lands. Twin Peaks is one of the oldest fire crews at the State, established in 2004. Throughout the 2024 fire season, we responded to wildfires in Arizona, California, Idaho, and New Mexico to aid in fire suppression, ending the season with more than 1,100 overtime hours.

Twin Peaks is seeking **one** highly skilled and motivated applicant to fill the squad leader position for the 2025 wildfire season. To excel as a squad leader on Twin Peaks, it is imperative to embody qualities of resourcefulness, teamwork, and respect. This role demands proficiency, not only in tactical responsibilities, but also in administrative tasks.

Collaboration between the other squad leader, assistant, and crew boss is essential to maintain a secure environment. Tactical sense plays a pivotal role in the decision-making process, built upon your previous experience. An effective squad leader will make sound and decisive choices, always prioritizing safety.
