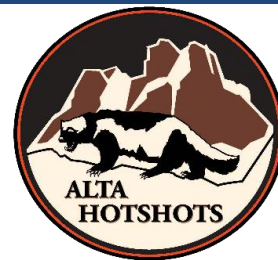

The Alta Interagency Hotshot Crew is seeking individuals that are team players with Grit and Drive to fill a Permanent Seasonal Squad Leader Position.

The ideal candidate is someone who can assimilate within our crew culture of training and open communication and wants to be a part of a hardworking highly reliable organization. We don't subscribe to the "old ways" but rather set forth our expectations as a crew and as individuals and encourage folks to speak up. Each member of the Alta Hotshots knows what's expected of them and they'll be held to that standard and treated as the adults that they are.

The Alta IHC Squad Leader plays a pivotal role in shaping the future and development of our crew members. They are required to educate and train their squad members while providing them with feedback and evaluations. Furthermore, our Squad Leaders will be role models for the crew and strive to seek out and take advantage of opportunities to expand upon their own knowledge within their fire career.

To operate as a highly reliable organization it requires us to foster open communication and transparency at all levels. We encourage everyone to speak up, voice concerns, hesitations and ask questions and Squad Leaders can expect to field some of those questions. Additionally, it's not uncommon that Squad Leaders will have to make quick and timely decisions while rapidly utilizing the risk management process, so being confident in yourself and the experience you bring will be an attribute that will serve you well.

The incumbent must be prepared for rigorous physical training. This includes but is not limited to trail running, hiking, and calisthenics. The incumbent must meet the Hotshot fitness requirements as described in the Standards for Interagency Hotshot Crew Operations (SIHCO).
